



Homebound Teacher

JOB DESCRIPTION

The Homebound Teacher, under the direction of the Director of Special Education, participates as a member of the instructional staff in planning for teaching, motivating students, developing classroom climate, managing the classroom, interacting with pupils and evaluating pupils.

EDUCATIONAL AND CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Bachelor's Degree with appropriate certification

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

1. Plans the long and short range objectives for assigned courses
2. Develops lesson plans with the appropriate TEKS by coordinating with campus teachers or by using District frameworks
3. Insures that student and teacher will have adult supervision during class sessions
4. Collects and uses a variety of information to guide the growth and development of individual pupils
5. Demonstrates effective teaching methods and selects appropriate teaching materials using a variety of activities to develop student interest and performance
6. Establishes standards for individual pupils in terms of ability levels
7. Creates a classroom climate conducive to pupil intellectual, social, emotional, and moral development
8. Manages pupil behavior and activities to allow for learning
9. Evaluates and provides feedback on pupil performance continuously by utilizing a variety of sources to insure mastery of the essential elements
10. Teaches for cognitive, affective, and/or psychomotor learning and transfer
11. Administers appropriate standardized tests, i.e., TAKS, SDAA, class tests or other evaluations
12. Develops and updates per the student Individual Educational Program (IEP)
13. Maintains accurate student accounting records and other reports in compliance with local and state requirements
14. Participates in in-service workshops
15. Participates in extracurricular activities as assigned
16. Plans for and engages in professional development
17. Participates in the planning, presentation, and evaluation of various school activities
18. Confers with pupil's regular teachers to insure continuity of instruction
19. Submits grades earned in homebound teaching to school counselor/data processing
20. Coordinates attendance accounting with the appropriate person
21. Maintains a current teacher's daily schedule in the Special Education office
22. Performs other duties as assigned

MENTAL DEMANDS

Ability to communicate effectively (verbal and written), interpret policies and procedures, reason, read, understand verbal instructions, analyze, differentiate, coordinate, compile, instruct, and maintain emotional control.

PHYSICAL DEMANDS

Ability to lift and/or carry moderate weight (15-44 pounds), sit, stand, walk, climb stairs or ladder, reach, repetitive hand motions, hear, speak, travel within the District and occasionally outside the district/county, may experience prolonged and irregular work hours, and work with frequent interruptions.
