

## *Camp Invention Registration*

Camp Invention is a program available at Title I campuses in the District. This one week summer camp explores the engineering process through trial and error in a fun and exciting way. Students work through four modules in the day, each one tackles a different aspect of design – creation, modification, sales, and usability. Students build robotic dogs, the house of the future, and other engaging activities.

To attend the student needs to be in attendance at one of the following campuses:

Candlewood; Hopkins; Converse; Elolf; Franz; Miller's Point; Spring Meadows; Hartman; Park Village; Paschall or Woodlake Elementary Schools. Each campus will be given 30 spots for students to attend the Camp Invention on June 10<sup>th</sup> – 13<sup>th</sup>. The primary focus is 4<sup>th</sup> graders, but we will gladly accept current 3<sup>rd</sup> – 5<sup>th</sup> grade students.

Teachers at these campuses will be given flyers to go home with the students. We will do our best to accommodate all students who apply, but must limit total enrollment at each camp.

i.e. If we don't get 30 students from Candlewood, and we have more than 30 from Converse, we will just bring more students over from Converse until we reach capacity.

Candlewood, Converse and Elolf students will be bussed to Hopkins for the camp. Franz and Spring Meadows students will be bussed to Miller's Point, and Hartman, Park Village and Woodlake students will be bussed to Paschall.

Flyers will be sent to the campuses for the students as soon as the teachers and coordinators are hired.
