CONSIDERATION OF CONSENT ITEMS

Items A, F, H, I, J from agenda passed unanimously

B. Consider and take action regarding approving of Expenditures Equal to or Greater than \$50,000 (Stanford)- Great Minds (Eureka)- discussed how we evaluate program effectiveness; AED Equipment- discussed ensuring the location of the devices are communicated, as well as training for personnel; Class Catalyst program- student checkin that serves to gauge a student's mental capacity for the day, program suggests several mindful practices for a student to use, teachers may receive an alert and also

have a library of mindful practices that they can use with the class or with individual students; **motion passed unanimously**

- C. Consider and take action regarding approving the monthly financial statement as of May 31, 2023 (Ryan)- discussed monies from previous bonds, will include 2022 bond monies spent in future statements; **motion passed unanimously**
- D. Consider and take action regarding approving the ranking for Request for Proposal 22-46 Point of Sale System for the Judson ISD Child Nutrition Department (Ryan)-clarification for selecting a company who was not the lowest bidder- compatible with current systems, met district needs the best; motion passed unanimously
- E. Consider and take action regarding approving the ranking for Request for Proposal 23-01 Annual Financial Audit (Ryan)- clarification for selecting a company who was not the lowest bidder- newer finance staff have previous relationships/experiences and were able to provide additional feedback; **motion passed unanimously**
- G. Consider and take action regarding approving the ranking of Request For Proposal 22-43 for the Medical Third Party Administrator and the Pharmacy Benefit Manager for the 2024 plan year (Ryan)- clarifications on the differences and benefits for our employees; Lucent will be the Third Party Administrator for medical insurance and PCA RX will be the Pharmacy Benefit Manager; Medical insurance benefits will cost the same amount as the previous plan but will include enhanced benefits such as zero deductible primary and urgent care, complex imaging, surgical procedures, etc.- more details will be shared with the staff soon; motion passed unanimously
- K. Consider and take action regarding approving the Optional Flexible School Day Program (OFSDP) 2023-2024 application for Judson High School, Judson Learning Academy, Judson Early College Academy, Veterans Memorial High School, and Wagner High School (Ryan)- explanation of the OFSD Program; motion approved unanimously
- L. Consider and take action regarding approving Communities in Schools Service Delivery Agreement for the 2023-2024 school year (Macias)- discussion on benefit and success of the programs; program supervisor will be housed at Converse ES; motion passed unanimously
- M. Consider and take action regarding approving Meadows Mental Health Policy Institute for Texas professional service agreement for the 2023-2024 school year (Macias)- Meadows encompasses services through agencies such as Clarity, Rise Recovery, Children's Bereavement Center; Meadows staff is housed at the ERC until the Wraparound Service Center is ready; students, staff and families can receive the counseling services that they need; motion passed unanimously
