

Ford Automotive Career Exploration is a partnership program between Ford Motor Company, Ford and Lincoln dealerships, and secondary and post-secondary educational institutions. The intent of the program is to raise awareness and increase interest in career opportunities within the automotive industry, ultimately as a service technician.

There are no fees to educational institutions to participate in the Ford ACE program. The only requirement for a school to participate is to be sponsored by a local Ford/Lincoln dealership.

Students attending a Ford ACE partnership school can obtain valuable knowledge of Ford/Lincoln vehicle systems by completing Web-Based Training (WBT) via our Learning Management System (LMS). These courses are a subset of the same courses taken by our current dealership technicians. By completing these WBT courses, the students are one step closer towards a career in the automotive industry, beginning as an entry level automotive service technician at a Ford/Lincoln dealership.

What skills will I learn by completing the WBT courses offered via the LMS?

The LMS offers specialty training in areas such as New Model Training, Electrical Systems, Steering & Suspension and Brakes. In addition, there are courses that provide information about the history of Ford Motor Company, our vision for future products, collision repair, and Ford specific service routines.



Do I get a certificate?

Certificates can be printed after each course is completed. If you choose to attend one of our Technical Career Entry Programs or accept a position at a Ford/Lincoln dealership, you will be given credit for the courses you have successfully completed. By having completed these courses, you will have a competitive edge when seeking employment at a Ford/Lincoln dealership.
