



JUDSON ISD HALL OF HONOR RECOGNITION PROGRAM

Introduction

The Judson ISD Hall of Honor Recognition Program acknowledges those who have achieved and reflected a positive example and embody the spirit of Judson ISD. Being a part of the Judson ISD Hall of Honor is one of our highest tributes. Inductees have used their talents and abilities to overcome challenges and obstacles to achieve excellence in either the world of athletics or in a civic sense as contributors in our society.

District employees and the community may nominate someone they feel lives out the integrity and accomplishments of being a member of the Judson ISD Hall of Honor. A person can enter the Hall of Honor as an Athletic or Civic inductee. Individuals or teams selected to be inducted into the Judson ISD Hall of Honor will be announced and celebrated at the Judson Education Foundation Gala.

The sitting selection committees may convene at any time to evaluate and recommend that an individual/team be removed from a Hall of Honor due to behavior or actions:

- 1) that portray Judson ISD in a negative light or
- 2) that would not serve as a positive model for the students and community of Judson ISD

Nomination Criteria

(last revised by the Hall of Honor Board Advisory Committee in August 2021)

The criterion outlined below has been reviewed by the Judson ISD Board of Trustees. Inductees to both the Athletic and Civic Hall of Honor will be recognized collectively in the “Judson ISD Hall of Honor.”

Athletic Hall of Honor

Nominees may be inducted into the Athletic Hall of Honor based upon the person or team's significant achievement in the athletic arena, contribution to the positive image of Judson ISD, and/or journey to achieve excellence. Nominees must also meet the following criteria below. The criteria can be reviewed and changed annually.

Athletic criteria will be outlined in a nomination application where the individual completing the form provides detailed qualifications for each nominee. Supplemental information may be included with the completed application.

Individual Nominee

- Must be a Judson ISD graduate, employee, or former employee
- If the employee is a coach, the nominee must be retired from the profession for at least 3 years
- May not be considered for induction into the Athletic Hall of Honor if the individual is related to a selection committee member
- Any individual that has been inducted into another Hall of Fame or Hall of Honor can automatically be admitted into the Judson ISD Athletic Hall of Honor

Team Nominee

- Any Judson ISD athletic team
- May not be considered for induction into the Athletic Hall of Honor if a team member is related to a selection committee member
- Any team that has been inducted into another Hall of Fame or Hall of Honor can automatically be admitted into the Judson ISD Athletic Hall of Honor
- All State Champions are automatically admitted into the Judson ISD Hall of Honor at least 3 years after attaining the title. This honor would be retroactive; prior state champions will be enshrined in phases.

Selection Committee

A selection committee will evaluate nominees submitted by the public. The selection committee will be composed of the superintendent or designee, a principal or designee from each comprehensive high school, two representatives from the athletic department and three community representatives appointed by the board of trustees for a total of 9 committee members. The community representatives should reside in separate high school attendance zones.

- If an individual/team has not been selected for the Athletic Hall of Honor after being nominated 5 times, that individual/team is no longer eligible for approval.
- At a minimum, 5 years must elapse following graduation for an individual to be inducted in the Athletic Hall of Honor. For teams, a minimum of 5 years must elapse following date of accomplishment.

The committee will convene each fall semester and conclude its selection process no later than the last day of November. Recommendations will be forwarded to the JISD Board of Trustees for final approval.

Annual Inductees

A maximum of two recipients (individual or team collectively) may be inducted to the Athletic Hall of Honor annually.

Civic Hall of Honor

Nominees may be inducted in the Civic Hall of Honor based on significant contributions to the positive image or service to Judson ISD in non-athletic accomplishments and their journey to achieve excellence. Individuals may be both Judson ISD graduates or non-Judson ISD graduates (as an employee or volunteer). Substantial impact for non-JISD graduates will be identified by one or more of the following contributions over a period of at least 10 years.

Nominees may be nominated based on significant achievement, impact or influence in the areas below. The criteria can be reviewed and changed annually.

1. Leadership in the Judson ISD community
2. Responsibility in the Judson ISD community
3. Service in the Judson ISD community
4. Acts of kindness or compassion
5. Major career achievement and/or contributions

Nominees will be evaluated on their involvement in their respective communities; extraordinary career status/success; contributions to the community and beyond; and how these areas have allowed them to give back to and contribute to the positive image of Judson ISD. Civic criteria will be outlined in a nomination application where the individual completing the form provides detailed qualifications for each nominee. Supplemental information may be included with the completed application.

Selection Committee

A selection committee will evaluate nominees submitted by the public. The selection committee will be comprised of the superintendent or designee, four representatives from the Superintendent Student Advisory Group, two educators from the district level (elementary/secondary), and three community representatives appointed by the board of trustees for a total of 9 committee members. The community representatives should reside in separate high school attendance zones.

- If an individual has not been selected for the Civic Hall after being nominated 5 times, that individual is no longer eligible for approval.
- At a minimum, 5 years must elapse following graduation for an individual to be enshrined in the Civic Hall.

The committee will convene each fall semester and conclude its selection process no later than the last day of November. Recommendations will be forwarded to the JISD Board of Trustees for final approval.

Annual Inductees

A maximum of two recipients may be inducted to the Civic Hall of Honor annually.
