### At Home

- Help your child complete weekly homework.
- Read with your child for 15-20 minutes daily.
- Discuss and review school expectations.

### Students

First grade students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can be successful in school. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning and school.

- Talk to my family about what I learned at school.
- Read with my family daily.
- Complete my homework each night.
- Take my take home folder home, and have my parents check it nightly.
- Come to school on time and be ready to learn.
