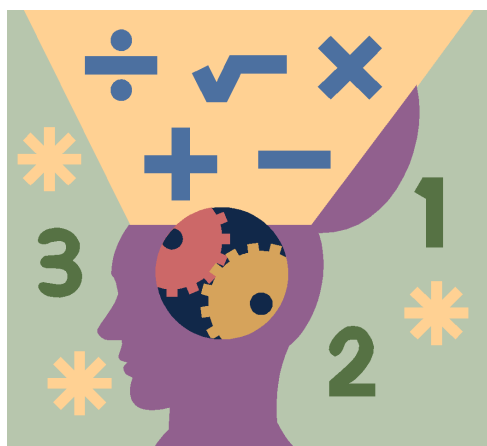


What is a Family-School Compact?

Wortham Oaks Elementary School parents joined the staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math. Families may have other ideas to add to the list.

Try to attend Family Literacy Night and Science Night

Play games to practice sight words and reading skills using hands-on activities (shaving cream, magazine cut-outs, rainbow writing)

Read with my child everyday: ask questions about what we have read; encourage students to make predictions and share their feelings about stories you read together; read books from home and books sent from school.

Engage my child in conversation about learning

Look for the campus newsletter throughout the school year
