Wortham Oaks Día de Los Muertos Community Altar



What is *Día De los Muertos* (Day of the Dead)?

- ★ Día de los Muertos, also known as 'Day of the Dead', is a Mexican holiday that has origins in Aztec traditions and is celebrated throughout Latin America.
- ★ Día de los Muertos, is celebrated on two days- November 1st (All Saints Day) and November 2nd (All Souls Day). It is believed that the spirits of our ancestors visit us on these two days.
- ★ During Día de los Muertos we celebrate and remember our loved ones that have passed away- it is a time to share memories and honor our loved ones.
- ★ We celebrate our loved ones by creating an *ofrenda*, or altar. An *ofrenda* is a special display that is carefully decorated and covered with items that evoke the memory of our loved ones.
- ★ Some of the items placed on the altar are: candles, *calaveras* (sugar skulls), flowers, *papel picado* (paper banners), bread and other food items. Of course the most important item we place on the altar is the photos of our ancestors.

Wortham Oaks Community *Ofrenda* (Altar)

Wortham Oaks will be putting together a Community Altar for all Wortham Oaks staff, students and families. The Altar will be on display from October 10-November 3rd in the main lobby for all students and families to see.

If you would like to contribute to our altar by adding a picture of your loved ones please submit a copy of the photo by Tuesday, October 10th! Make sure your photo is labeled on the back with your child's name and grade level so that we can return it back to you. If possible, please place your photo in a frame-this will make it easier for us to display, but if you do not have a frame we will still find a way to display it on the altar.

We thank you in advance for your participation in our Community Day of the Dead Altar. We hope that learning about other cultures and traditions encourages and builds community among the students.

What needs to be strengthened at Wortham Oaks?

A little more information to parents when they have enrolled a new student to the school. i.e.

how to put money on their school lunch account, communication when their school lunch account is not working. What line to be in for pick up, depending what grade they are in.

Administration relationship building with families. The school seems more like a business at times rather than a school community. Getting to know students and families on an administrative level would be helpful to the school community. My child has been there for a couple years but has never mentioned the administration. At other schools, admin is known and knows the children and families. I know it's a big school, but it can be done. It would be nice to have a balance of academics AND school community. I would like my child to have a whole child approach and I think that it is missed because school is too focused on academic achievement rather than the child themselves. It starts at the top and is noticed once you step on the campus that the administration doesn't have strong relationships with the families. My child is not aware and loves school, I applaud that my child feels safe and loves attending Wortham. I love the teachers as I know they have always communicated, built strong relationships with my child, challenge when needed and nurtured when needed. Again, I'd like to see that relationship continue with administration and as a whole campus community.

Encourage parents to be more involved and actually let them be involved. Many times I've heard how little time the teachers have to get things done, yet there hasn't been much done to let parents actually help. Decorating hallways, setting up for class parties, helping out with things teachers may need like cutting things up or whatever. The PTO really is only involved in the big things. Not the classrooms.

Everything is great, nothing at this time.

First I'll say, I know teachers are beyond busy. As a parent of a pre-k 4 child, it would be really nice to receive more daily information about their day (especially photos-really helps calm a parent's and grandparent's mind). Did they cry, nap, eat lunch/snack today? Why/why not do you think? (My child has been coming home with their snack almost daily and unfinished lunch. At pickup he's so hungry so it would be great to help reiterate what is being said at school to help him remember to eat/drink. Knowing if they napped during rest time, helps us know how much time we have after school to spend together before he needs to go to sleep for the night, as well.

Having the "student captains" and having them act in a teacher/coach's capacity (where they make the calls or decisions on what, and which, students can do what) has been a problem the last few years. I would reconsider having this format and maybe have them encourage and pump others up rather than making disciplinary decisions of other students.

I haven't had great response time on Remind

I would love to see more focus on critical thinking skills and less on ineffective homework or worksheets

I'm content with the school. This is my sons first year in school. He started kinder and we absolutely love it.

Initially, it was difficult to know what was going on with Pre-K3 child's daily routines and schedule, but it appears that we are getting that information now (in September vs. August).
