4. Mr. Ernesto Cox Jr. – Presented the Bully Prevention Programs currently being used in the Elementary programs.
 - A. Why Try (Journal) Elementary Program: Focus is on social/emotional development and making good choices. The program is music based and is designed to be fun and playful.
 - B. Second Steps K-5 – Focus is on social and academic success. Kinder and 1st grade focuses on listening to rules and making friends. 2nd and 3rd grade focuses on getting along with peers and paying attention. 4th and 5th grade deals with managing emotions.
 - C. Copies of the Middle and High School course catalogues were provided for viewing. Currently, there are no other offerings that would afford dual credits.
5. Mr. Joe Gonzalez
 - a. District Improvement Plan – District goal is to develop a 10 yr. plan. This plan is a working document that is ever changing.
 - b. The District will be looking to the community and State for assistance in future development. The district is currently on track with financial aspects of the plan.
 - c. The needs assessment summary was provided and included Child Nutrition, JISD Police Department (Gang Awareness) and Transportation.
 - d. Facility meetings are scheduled to begin around February 7, 2012.
